
GAJJU THE MASCOT OF MYSURU PACKAGE 2


About the design:

To design a befitting mascot for branding the city of Mysuru, I chose the form of an elephant, named 'Gajju'. Elephant being a gentle giant, an intrinsic part of Mysuru culture, its ecological balance, and omnipresent in the city's events and traditions, became an ideal choice. Elephants are also an integral part of the regional art forms like Kinnal paintings and in festivals like the Dasara processions.

Gajju is shown wearing the traditional dress of Mysuru. The headgear is a turban known as Mysuru Peta worn at auspicious occasions earlier by Wadiyar dynasty and now also by proud people of Mysuru, inviting people from all around the world to experience the richness of this region. The bottom wear is the dhoti or Panche which is the traditional wear of men in Karnataka. The Panche depicts the elegance of Mysuru but also its simplicity as it is worn by one and all. The chandan 'teeka' on Gajju's forehead depicts the wisdom and knowledge, and also represents the iconic sandalwood of Mysuru.






